20TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

From the Pastor The Cost of Peace!

How often have you kept "peace" no matter what the cost; probably more often than you care to remember. Most of us were probably

raised with the notion that it is better to do whatever is necessary to keep the peace rather than to be fighting all of the time. Well, if we are to do what the gospel is asking of us today, peace should not be one of our priorities. Jesus is telling us that if we are to be sincere about following the gospel then we must be willing to forgo peace.

We like to imagine Christianity as a religion of harmony and peace and sometimes we blind ourselves to passages such as today's: "I have come for division" (Jesus in the gospel); "You have not yet resisted to the point of shedding blood" (Hebrews, second reading); "He is demoralizing the soldiers...and all the people by speaking such things" (Jeremiah, first reading); "I have come to set the earth on fire" (gospel).

History has certainly shown us what can happen to people who speak against the norm in the name of the common good. We can all remember Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr. in his struggle to lead a nonviolent civil rights movement. It eventually led to his death and the ruination of many people along the way. Prophetic voices are not the most welcome in any day or age. Even today prophetic voices in Latin America, Africa, and Asia, who cry out for justice and religious tolerance, are killed. Nobody likes to be told that they are living wrong or that their priorities are all out of sync, and for certain no political leader likes to hear the truth about their mistakes or foiled plans.

The decision to follow Jesus can meet harsh rejection. To walk in the footsteps of Jesus can mean a loss of peace and security. If we look at how Jesus lived and the way he taught we can clearly see that he is the supreme model of faith who allows us to maintain our hope in the promises that God has made to us. Like Jesus we do not choose division and strife, divisions occur simply by being faithful to God's message. This becomes the real shock of the gospel: being a faithful disciple of Jesus will instigate a clash of values, of principles, of priorities. The message of Jesus is divisive because it calls others to a radical way of living - self-giving for the good of others. We all have to make a conscious decision to follow him or not, to share his passion or not, to be self-giving as he is. If we compromise our gospel message in order to have peace now, we forfeit the everlasting peace which is promised to the faithful disciple. The choice is ours.

We are hardly called to be like Jeremiah to announce to the Israelites that their beloved Jerusalem fell into the hands of the Babylonians – nor are we thrown into a cistern to die! Nor like Jesus will we be nailed to a cross because of our preaching. Nevertheless, we are called to be faithful to God's word in the small, everyday things as well as at times when the more serious challenges come along. We do not seek division, but we seek consistency in living gospel values. Gospel living is never easy!

Sacramental Prep / Faith Formation



It is hard to believe that school will be starting in just a couple weeks. Summer always seems to go by so quickly, and we don't appreciate these summer days until January when we long for the warmth. Regardless of how fast these months have gone, we turn our thoughts to the beginning of another school year.

Sharing our faith and passing it on to our children is one of the greatest responsibilities a parent has. When we have our children baptized we make that promise to do all in our power to see that our children are raised in the church. This responsibility is not only one for parents but it is one for the church as well. We must provide and environment where your child can learn about the church they profess to belong to.

As we assume these responsibilities as your parish family, we look to the starting of this year's formation program. We have registration forms in the church, as well as on our parish website, so that you can get your children registered. We are also looking for people to volunteer their services to the program this year. If you think you might be interested in helping with our formation program, please call the office and we will let Scott Martin know about it. There are many ways that you can help. The more people involved the more we will be able to do with the program.

Another aspect of our Formation Programming is the area that deals with Sacramental Prep. If your child is in **the second grade and has completed one year of Formation**, then they are eligible to receive the sacraments of First Eucharist and First Penance. ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Tomorrow, Monday, the Church celebrates Mary's welcome to heaven. Eastern traditions call this event the "Dormition" or "sleeping" of Mary, indicating that she did not die but was taken to heaven as if asleep. Pope Pius XII declared the bodily assumption of Mary into heaven as a dogma of the church in 1950.



Since the Solemnity of the Assumption falls on a Monday, the obligation to attend Mass has been abrogated. For those who wish to attend Mass, although there is no obligation, Mass is celebrated Monday, 8 a.m. at Epiphany of Our Lord in Monessen.

The Parish Office will be closed this Monday, August 15, in observance of the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.
