From the Pastor What is our Pearl of great price?

Today we have more of Jesus' parables in the gospel, but their tone and audience are

different. Now it is no longer the crowds Jesus addresses, as for the past two weeks, but His disciples. And unlike the focus in the past on the mysterious power of growing things, today we hear how wise people seize the moment: There is a treasure to be gained, there are fish to be caught and sorted for those of worth. Like the parables of the past few weeks, we are given a story to ponder in our hearts and see how they apply to our lives.

It seems we are always searching for treasure. We spend billions of dollars on lottery tickets each year hoping to hit the jackpot. Metal detectors enable us to comb beaches and parks for coins and other possible treasures. TV game shows are growing more and more popular. Our search for treasure isn't necessarily an indication that we are unhappy with our lot in life; it is an indication that we hope for more. So it is with our life in God! The stories we hear today show us different ways people find the Kingdom of God: by chance, by diligent search, by careful discernment.

The stage is set for the "wisdom" one needs to find this great treasure through the first reading with its presentation of the great King Solomon and his unusual request from God. No matter how we choose to set out finding the Kingdom there are two things that we will all need. First of all we will need the wisdom to recognize the overwhelming worth of the Kingdom when it appears, the same wisdom requested by Solomon of God. Secondly we will need the boldness to be willing to stake all on the kingdom. The gospel calls each of us to be wise and bold.

The wisdom that Solomon requested and for which he is famous is one of the most valued virtues of the Old Testament tradition. Like Solomon, we must ask for wisdom so that we can recognize the great treasure of the kingdom of God when it appears. We all need the "understanding heart" so that we can be wise and bold about our discipleship, about recognizing the presence of God's Kingdom and about cultivating grateful hearts for the great treasure God has offered us in Jesus Christ. There can be no other treasure than this: to have an "understanding heart" and to "know what is right."

The message that we find in the gospels is definitely good news. However, do we live our Christian life as a tedious routine or as the joyful response of people who know they have found the treasure and the pearl that fulfill all their dreams and aspirations? Ultimately the question we all must ask is: does our faith in Jesus make us happier? The question is worth asking, and no one but us can know what the answer is.

Right now, nearly 20 Filipino priests serve as missionaries in parishes throughout the Diocese of Greensburg. Bishop Medil Sacay Aseo, Bishop of Tagum in the Philippines, will be present for the event. In 2018 Bishop Medil Aseo, then, Father Medil Aseo, was serving as Parochial Vicar at St. Mary, Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish in Kittanning and St. Mary, Mother of God Parish in Yatesboro, when he was appointed by our Holy Father, Pope Francis, as Bishop of the Diocese of Tagum.

To celebrate his visit, and give thanks for all our International priests, a Mass, celebrated by Bishop Kulick, and an International Food Festival will be held at the Christ Our Shepherd Center, on **August 25** at 5:30 PM to raise funds to support the priestly formation program in the Diocese of Tagum. The Diocese of Tagum has the largest group of priests serving our diocese in our International Priests Program.
