

Scripture Reflection This Week

In Luke 22:14—23:56, we witness the profound love of Christ as He faces betrayal, suffering, and death—a poignant reminder of His unwavering commitment to humanity. As we reflect on this Passion narra-



tive, we are invited to consider the depths of God's mercy and the call to our own discipleship. The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us that Christ's Passion fulfills the prophecy of Isaiah: "by his wounds, we are healed" (Isaiah 53:5; CCC 559). This passage underscores not only Christ's willingness to embrace suffering but also invites us to recognize the salvific power of our own trials

In moments of despair, we find solace in Jesus's words from the cross: "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do" (Luke 23:34). This call to forgiveness is central to our faith, echoing the catechetical teaching that "anyone who wishes to be a follower of Christ must take up his cross" (CCC 2015). As we journey through Lent, let us embrace our own crosses, trusting in the redemptive grace that flows from Christ's sacrifice, and engage in acts of love and mercy toward others. This holy season beckons us to grow ever closer to the heart of our Savior.



Paschal Candle

The Paschal Candle is a symbol of the risen Christ. On Easter Sunday it is placed next to the pulpit for the 50 days of Easter; after Easter it is placed near the Baptismal Font and is lighted for Baptisms and Funerals. If you would like to sponsor either a portion or the whole cost of the Paschal Candle, please call the Parish Office. This Candle may be in memory of a loved one, or for a special intention.

Three Days

The Triduum celebrates the heart of Christian faith, to which all leads, and from which all flows: Jesus' redemptive death and resurrection; related to the Church year as Sunday is to each week. It begins with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper and continues through Good Friday and Holy Saturday culminating with the celebration of the Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday. We invite you and your families to be as much a part of this year's celebrations as you are able.

Thursday: Mass of the Last Supper: 7:00 PM—(Followed by Eucharistic Adoration until 9:30 pm.)

Friday: Celebration of the Lord's Passion: 1:00 PM (The Church will be open until 9:30 pm.)

Saturday: Easter Vigil: 8:30 PM

Thursday: Chrism Mass 10:00 AM At the Blessed Sacrament Cathedral in Greensburg, the Chrism Mass is when the Bishop along with all of the priests of the diocese blesses and consecrates the Holy Oils that will be used throughout the year. It is also the Mass where the priests of the diocese re-dedicate their ministry to the people of the church as well as to the Bishop.

The Mass of the Last Supper

Holy Thursday liturgy marks the institution of the Eucharist. We remember that Jesus gathered with His Disciples for the last time and gave to them as well as to the future church this miraculous gift. It is through the presence of the Body and Blood of Christ that we are able to become "Church." As an example of what it means to be church and celebrate this gift, the women from our parish will "dress" the altar. Another important gift that Jesus gave to the Church is the example of what it means to serve as well as to be served. Through the symbolism of the washing of the feet, lesus calls each of us to be of service to one another, as well as to be open to being



served. As we commemorate what Jesus did for the Disciples through the washing of the feet. Fr. Vincent would like to have representatives from the various ministries of our parish be a part of the Foot Washing. If you are interested please call the office.

Adoration after Mass

After the Liturgy on Holy Thursday there will be Eucharistic Adoration. The Blessed Sacrament will be in repose on the Blessed Mother side of the altar after Mass. As soon as Mass is over the altar will be stripped completely bare. While this is going on, I ask that the people remaining in church maintain a decorum of silence and reverence. You are welcome to come and spend some time in prayer until 9:30. Then the Blessed Sacrament will be taken from the altar and the church will be empty. Father will be available up until 9:30 PM for Confession.

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY April 27, 2025

The Sunday after Easter is known as Divine Mercy Sunday. In celebration of the Divine Mercy of Jesus, our Lord, there will be Eucharistic Adoration and

the recitation of the prayers of the Chaplet of Divine Mercy, following the 11:00 AM Mass.

Our Lord said to St. Faustina according to the Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska) "Encourage souls to say the chaplet which I have given you...Whoever will recite it will receive great mercy at the hour of death...Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy."
